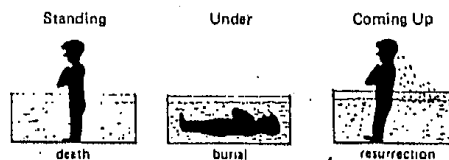

Perseverance Of The Saints

Lesson 10

Free Will Baptists believe in the doctrine of the “Perseverance of the Saints”. To “persist in faith in spite of difficulties, opposition, etc. There are strong grounds to hope that the truly regenerate will persevere unto the end, and be saved, through the power of divine grace which is pledged for their support; but their future obedience and final salvation are neither determined nor certain, since through infirmity and manifold temptations they are in danger of falling; and they ought, therefore, to watch and pray lest they make shipwreck of their faith and be lost. We believe in the freedom of the will. The will of a believer is still free after conversion. We believe that we are “kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation” 1 Peter 1:5, that the power of divine grace is the instrument through which we are kept saved. But that even this exercise of God’s power on our behalf is based on whether we avail ourselves of that power, whether we will to be kept, whether we continue to meet the condition of faith. Thus, salvation is just as conditional after regeneration as before. We believe our perseverance is “conditional” upon our faith in Jesus Christ. We do believe in assurance of salvation. 1 John 5:13.

Washing the Saints’ Feet

This is a sacred ordinance, which teaches humility and reminds the believer of the necessity of a daily cleansing from all sin. It was instituted by the Lord Jesus Christ, and called an “example” on the night of His betrayal, and in connection with the institution of the Lord’s Supper.
